    - 1. English

    - 4. Science
  - Students receive a score for each subject area and then a Composite score (average of the four subject areas)
  - Students are encouraged to take the ACT beginning in their sophomore year and retake the exam early in Senior year ( summer or fall )
  - All administrations, except the state-funded ACT given to juniors in the spring, must be registered by the student @ www.actstudent.org
