- **College Credit Plus Trustee Scholarship – Southern State Community College**
 - Granted by the Board of Trustees of Southern State to high school graduates from the graduating class preceding Fall semester who enroll full-time at Southern State and have successfully completed at least one College Credit Plus class offered through Southern State while in high school. Requirements: minimum grade point average 2.5, maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 for a second year renewal. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) required. Priority Deadline: August 1
- **Super Start Scholarship – Southern State Community College**
 - Designed to offer high school seniors the opportunity to accelerate their college goals by taking up to six credits tuition free during the summer semester immediately following the completion of their high school career. The scholarship is non-transferrable and can only be used during the summer semester. Requirements: restricted to graduating high school seniors with minimum 2.75 GPA. Deadline: May 1

- **College Applications:**
 - Take advantage of the 3 college visits.
 - Application Process:
 1. DEADLINES: if you still plan on applying to a school make sure to check their application DEADLINES.
 2. **NOTIFY THE GUIDANCE OFFICE** once you have completed and SUBMITTED your application! This is IMPORTANT. Your application will not be processed unless an OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT is sent directly from the High School.
 3. Should begin receiving notice of admission. Narrow down your choices by comparing your financial aid package from each school.
 4. Send ACT scores directly to the college through www.actstudent.org
- **Financial Aid – Completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)**
 - Every student applying to a college or university needs to complete this form

- Students may begin completing the FAFSA as early as OCTOBER 1st.
