  - Students may begin completing the FAFSA as early as OCTOBER 1<sup>st</sup>.

- **Graduation**
  - May 16<sup>th</sup> – Graduation Practice MUST ATTEND IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CEREMONY
    - All school fees must be paid at this time.
  - May 19<sup>th</sup> – Graduation
- Under federal law, virtually all men must register w/ the Selective Service w/in 30 days of their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.
  - Selective Service System now accepts early submission of registration information by 17-year-old men.
  - Fastest way to register is online at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov)
  - All male students completing and filing the FAFSA for college must register in order to be eligible for student loans and grants.
  - Males – make registering part of your graduation checklist!

## Juniors

- Take advantage of the 3 College Days.
  - Pick up College Visit Form in Guidance Office.
  - Schedule a College Visit with School of your Choice.
  - Bring back documentation from college the next school day.
- ACT Results
  - Results from your State – Funded ACT results should be received in the mail.
  - Plan to take the ACT @ least one more time
    - This summer or early fall depending on where you are applying to.
    - Visit [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org) for registration deadlines.
      - Also create your account to receive useful study tips for your next ACT administration!

    2. All dates are from 8:30 – 3:30 and cost \$60.00 per student

    4. JUNIORS – will have free access to this workshop in preparation for the state-funded ACT in March on February 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- Students are encouraged to take the ACT @ least twice while in high school
  - ACT is broken down into four parts
    1. English
    2. Reading
    3. Math
    4. Science
  - Students receive a score for each subject area and then a Composite score (average of the four subject areas)
  - Students are encouraged to take the ACT beginning in their sophomore year and retake the exam early in Senior year ( summer or fall )
  - All administrations, except the state-funded ACT given to juniors in the spring, must be registered by the student @ [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org)
