Mrs. Roberts' K/1st Grade News:

The kindergarten students have been working very hard on constructing one complete sentence in response to a journal topic. They have also been working very hard on learning all of the letters and their corresponding sounds, and they have been doing so well with blending CVC words!

The 1st grade students have been working very diligently on writing 2 or 3 complete sentences in response to a journal topic. This week the 1st graders will be learning about the sound of long u. They have done a fantastic job with learning the long sounds of all of the vowels this year!

The kindergarten and 1st grade students have had the opportunity since the beginning of March to enjoy one-on-one time with a Wilmington College student that is completing hours in my classroom. They love being able to play games with her to practice skills!

Ms. Marion's 2nd Grade News:

In 2nd grade the students are using an APP "text to speech." This APP allows the student's to type a word and it will say the word for them or they can speak a word and it will spell the word for them. This is a great way to learn an unfamiliar word and works on their spelling.

Mrs. Bohrer's 3rd Grade News:

Third grade students have been working hard to prepare for the Reading AIR test. The students have made gains in reading fluency this nine weeks!

Mrs. Fawley's 4th Grade News:
