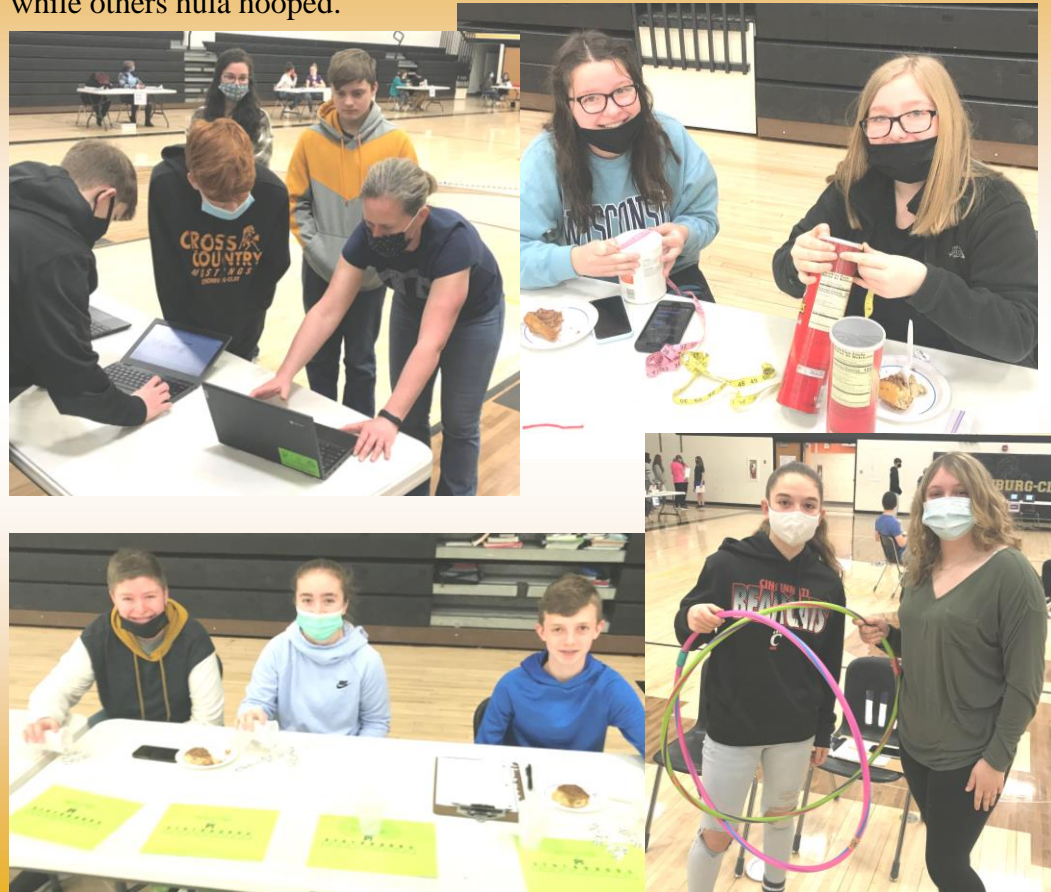
As always, let our staff know if you have any concerns or if we can assist your child in anyway.
