  - Every student applying to a college or university needs to complete this form
  - Students may begin completing the FAFSA as early as OCTOBER 1<sup>st</sup>.

  - All male students completing and filing the FAFSA for college must register in order to be eligible for student loans and grants.

    - This will be given during the school day
  - Students DO NOT need to register for this ACT administration
  - This administration DOES NOT include the Writing portion of the test
  - Registration is mandatory
- Take advantage of the 3 College Days.
  - Pick up College Visit Form in Guidance Office.
  - Schedule a College Visit with School of your Choice.
  - Bring back documentation from college the next school day.

  - All sophomores are required to take this practice ACT test
    - Scores from your practice test will be used to help prepare for State-Funded ACT given Spring 2021
